Dear Brothers and Sisters,



This year marks a major milestone for ATU Local 279: we secured one of the strongest contracts in our Local's history, including the most significant wage increases we have achieved to date. With this new agreement, ATU Local 279 will be returning to the bargaining table much sooner than before to continue fighting for what everyone rightfully deserves. Thanks to your unity and determination, this contract reflects the value of everyone's hard work and the respect everyone deserves. It is clear proof that when we stand together, we win together with our voice and our power.

While we celebrate our recent contract success, our work does not end here. Inflation, workload pressures, and scheduling challenges remain key priorities, and we are already preparing to address them. With the rail line extending to Trim Station next year, there will be significant changes to bus routes in the east end. These adjustments will affect day-to-day operations, including how you will book for the upcoming Spring booking.

I encourage everyone to stay informed and adaptable as these changes unfold. Please continue to share any operational concerns or issues you encounter. Your feedback allows us to identify challenges early so we can advocate for improvements.

Behind the scenes, we are actively advocating on your behalf to ensure your rights and concerns are protected. The Union will continue to apply pressure to ensure that every concern raised by members is taken seriously and addressed without delay.

I hope everyone is off to a great start to the Holiday Season, which is quickly approaching.

As I ponder my message to you all and reflect, it's dawned on me that we are at the halfway point of this current term. This amazes me because I feel so much has transpired in such a short time.

As we took on our new roles, we set out to bring unity to our local. While there is always work to do in that regard, we feel like we've made great progress towards this goal.



It is an integral step in our plan to demonstrate to management that ATU Local 279 is unified in our goal of achieving better working conditions.

With so little time from the election to contract negotiations, we needed to act quickly.

I feel like we achieved a tremendous turnaround in how members see their union at work. From collecting signatures for our petition to the council, and getting members to attend transit commission meetings, council meetings, or just wearing the WE RIDE TOGETHER t-shirts to show unity, we have certainly gotten management's attention and caught them off guard. The more visible we became, the more concerned they grew.

This was evident in the run-up to the contract negotiations, where they saw we were organizing.

In our efforts to organize, we took on new approaches with the help of our International Union and ATU Canada. For the first time as a 279 member, I got to witness the formation of a true negotiation committee, where members from each division participated in collecting data to bolster the Bargaining Team with indisputable facts that demonstrated how far behind we have fallen after the unprecedented 5-year contract.

It was truly impressive to see how that information was collected and assembled. It was clear that it was too overwhelming for management to digest it all.

While we understand some feel it fell short of their personal needs, the fact remains that, compared to any contract I have voted on since my start date here, we achieved the most significant gains to date and made up for the shortfalls of the last 5 years.

Of course, we'd like to see more language changes, yet these are still achievable through the grievance process, and we intend to do just that. In 2 years, we will be right back at the table to claim those shortfalls.

Other changes we have been taking on include bringing our Union Hall back to life. From pooling together to purchase a pool table for the hall, to some executive board members donating TVs and a stereo, and most recently, the addition of a vintage Ms. Pac-Man game, we've been updating our Club 279 to make it more appealing for members to visit and/or rent. This is part of a plan to give the hall back to the members to use, rather than have it sit empty and unused. For members who spend their split shifts with nowhere to go because they live too far, another aim is to create a place where you can come spend time between shifts that isn't at the garages.

The possibilities are endless. From hosting events to supporting groups, the hall can be used for so much. One thing I hope to help build would be an Open Mic night where people can come and share talents, spoken word, or blow off steam about issues our jobs bring with the support of others who wish to have these discussions with people other than families, who may be tired of hearing about OC Transpo day in and day out.

In my 21 years of experience, I have never seen a contract deliver a 7 percent wage increase in a single year. For many years, our agreements were tied to four- and five-year terms, but this time we returned to a three-year contract, giving our members more flexibility and more frequent opportunities to renegotiate under better conditions. The agreement also reflects major improvements our members identified as priorities, including meaningful market adjustments, annual wage increases, expanded benefits, faster vacation accrual, improvements to classifications, and the complete removal of non-platform pay. Throughout this process, the support and confidence shown by our members meant a great deal and strengthened the Executive Board's commitment to securing the best possible agreement.

I would also like to recognize our shop stewards, who volunteer their time and stand as the backbone of this union. Their commitment, support, and daily work in the garages and workplaces make an enormous difference. The Executive Board relies on their insight and leadership, and I want to thank each of them for the vital role they play in strengthening our union family.

As winter settles in, I encourage everyone to remain vigilant at the end of your runs and before returning to the garage. A quick check of your bus ensures no one seeking shelter is left behind and helps protect both our passengers and our members during the coldest months of the year.

I want to express my sincere appreciation for the hard work each of you demonstrates daily. You keep our city moving through challenging conditions, and I am proud to represent such a dedicated and resilient group of individuals. 


Dear Brothers and Sisters,
